



## Election Day Exit Polling Results – November 8, 2022

This year's edition of our Election Day Exit Polling program was a grand learning experience! So many lessons and life skills -- talking to people you've never met, answering impromptu questions, sharing insights about civics and candidates, being brave, adjusting one's approach to convince voters to complete the exit poll, and more! Many thanks to the students, teachers, and parents who made today possible.

This year was peculiar because of the new early voting period. The voting public was overwhelmingly gracious to our students -- for which we are grateful. There was also a little more reluctance to participate in our educational exit poll than in prior years. So, these numbers are presented without commentary.
